Welcome to our Research Activity Report for the Health Promotion Research Centre for the years 2023 and 2024. In these two years, we have organised two highly successful conferences, delivered a work programme as required by our World Health Organisation Collaborating Centre status, contributed to health promotion research networks and disseminated our work internationally, nationally and locally.

Our **Annual Conference in 2023** was entitled 'Strengthening Intersectoral Health Promotion Action: Building Healthy Communities'. The conference was a successful event, with keynote presentations from Prof. Breda Smyth, Chief Medical Officer, Department of Health, Prof. Mark Gamsu, Leeds Beckett University, UK, Mr Vinnie O'Shea, National Coordinator, Healthy Ireland Local Government, Ms Gígja Gunnarsdóttir, Directorate of Health Iceland and Ms Rebecca McLaughlin, Health & Well Being, Irish Men's Sheds Association.

In the context of national policy developments on mental health promotion, such as the Health Service Executive Stronger Together: Mental Health Promotion Plan 2022-2025 and the development of Pathways to Wellbeing: National Mental Health Promotion Framework by the Department of Health, the **2024 Annual Conference** focused on Implementing a Systems Approach to

Mental Health Promotion: From Policy to Practice. We welcomed Ms Stephanie Priest, Executive Director, Mental Health and Wellbeing Division, Public Health Agency of Canada, Ms Soile Ridanpää, Senior Specialist, Ministry of Social Affairs and Health Finland, and Prof. Laura Shields-Zeeman, Head of Department, Public Mental Health, Trimbos Institute, the Netherlands as keynote speakers, ensuring a scholarly and stimulating event.

Our work as part of our designation as a **World Health Organisation Collaborating Centre** for Health Promotion Research continues, involving the successful delivery of a work programme that included the development of a briefing paper on effective strategies for enhancing subjective wellbeing, a technical background paper on best practices for enhancing the health literacy and wellbeing of communities, with a particular focus on the most vulnerable communities, evidence-based guidance to promote healthy environments in partnership with the Healthy Cities and Communities network, in addition to participation in a range of WHO activities and networks on the part of many of our staff.

We continue to work with our colleagues in the **Health Behaviour Change Research Group**, the **HRB Primary Care Clinical Trials Network** and the **PPI Ignite Network**, in the delivery of the

'population health' seminar series. The HPRC also hosted lots of undergraduate and graduate students and academics from around the globe, bringing their expertise and ideas to our research activities.

In 2023 we said **goodbye** to Dr Viv Batt who has been Administrative Director with us for many years. Viv goes on to undertake the Management of the School of Health Sciences. We wish her well and thank her for her immense contribution to the Health Promotion Research Centre for many years. Dr Elke Rink has now joined the staff at the HPRC in 2024, coming to us with extensive experience in research management. We look forward to working with Elke in the future.

June 2024 also saw the **retirement** of Dr Jane Sixsmith, a core member of our academic staff and Principal Investigator with the HPRC since its inception, acting as Director for many years, and Conference chair on a number of occasions. Jane significantly and successfully developed our

international profile in the area of health communication and literacy. We wish Jane a wonderful retirement and will miss her steady commitment and scholarly contribution to so many aspects of our work.

January 2024 also saw a **change of Director** with Prof. Margaret Hodgins taking over the reins from Prof. Colette Kelly, who has ably and professionally managed the HPRC since 2018.

In 2024 our School of Health Sciences underwent a research assessment exercise as part of the **Institutional Review of Research Performance (IRRP)**. The HPRC submitted two case studies that describe the impact of our work.

Following our re-designation as a World Health Organization (WHO) Collaborating Centre in 2021, we have worked to support the WHO work programme at WHO Headquarters in Geneva and the WHO Regional Office for Europe. The core focus of our work plan is on the development of health promotion capacity through the translation of health promotion research into policy and practice.

Our Terms of Reference for 2021 - 2025 are:

1. To support implementation of the WHO Thirteenth General Programme of Work 2019–2023 (GPW), with particular reference to the recommendations from the 10th Global Conference on “Health Promotion for Wellbeing, Equity and Sustainable Development”.
2. To support the WHO in the development and implementation of the Health Across the Life Course Strategy.

During 2023-24 this constituted the following activities:

1.1 Activity: Briefing paper on effective strategies for enhancing subjective wellbeing:

Prof. Margaret Barry

- Conducted a review of the scientific literature on the development and implementation of strategies for promoting subjective well-being at the population level.
- Produced a Briefing paper on effective strategies for enhancing subjective well-being on the key findings and their implications for policy and programme development

2.1 Activity: Produce a technical background paper on best practices for enhancing the health literacy and wellbeing of communities, with a particular focus on the most vulnerable communities: Dr Verna McKenna and Dr Jane Sixsmith

- A scoping review has been completed, the findings from which will feed into the development of the technical paper.

1.3 Activity: Develop evidence-based guidance to promote healthy environments in partnership with the Healthy Cities and Communities network: Dr Mary Jo Lavelle

- Protocol under development for a scoping review of the international literature on

the evidence-based on promoting healthy environments through built and green environments within the framework of Healthy Cities.

- The evidence-based guidance report will be developed in year 4. Consultation with various key experts from the Healthy Cities and Communities network will take place.

2.1 Activity: Provide technical support to incorporate the European Child and Adolescent Health strategy into the Health Across the Life Course strategy: Prof. Colette Kelly

- Contributed to the development of the European Child and Adolescent Health (CAH) Strategy including youth involvement in developing, revising and advocating for the strategy.

2.2 Activity Title: Support youth participation in WHO EURO activities: Prof. Colette Kelly

- Participated as a Steering Group member of the child and adolescent mental health quality of care programme to guide and support the involvement of youth in the quality of care programme.

2.3 Activity: Contribution to the international leadership of the Health Behaviour in School-aged Children (HBSC) study: Prof. Colette Kelly, Prof. Saoirse Nic Gabhainn and Dr András Költő

- Continued contribution to the development of the International Network of the Health Behaviour in School-aged Children (HBSC) study.

We also contribute to the work of the WHO on an ad-hoc basis by providing advice and support for emerging projects, attendance at WHO meetings, membership of Technical Advisory Groups and reviewing WHO documents during the drafting phase of development. For example, our centre is represented in the pan-European Mental Health Coalition of the WHO Regional Office for Europe, the Global Expert Group on Adolescent Well-being Measurement and the Technical Advisory Group for Schooling during COVID-19.

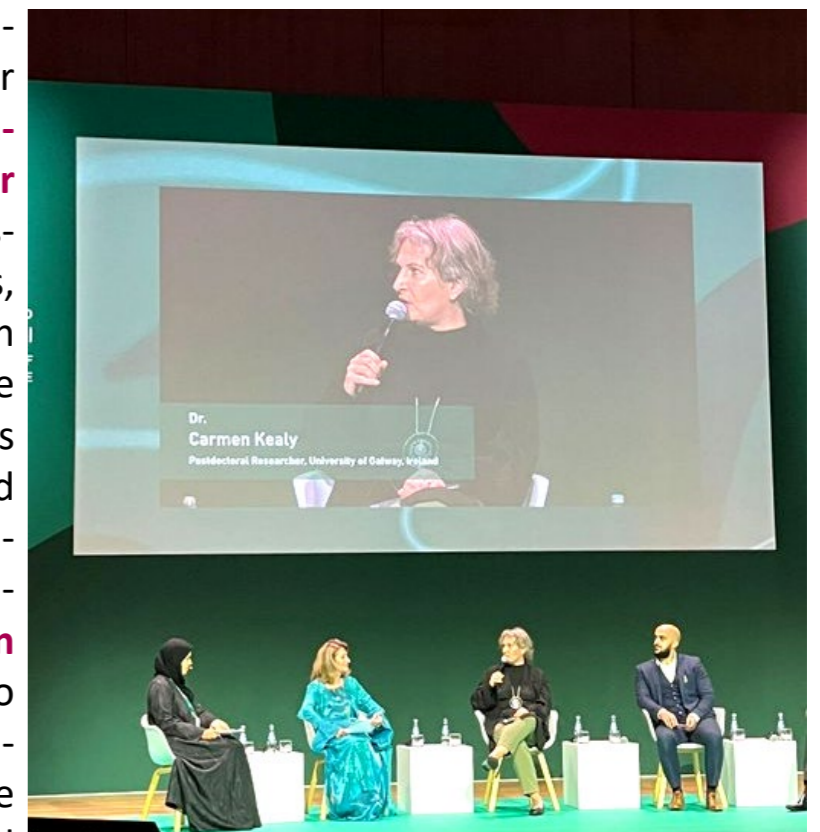

A Youthful Picture of Ireland



Prof Colette Kelly and Prof Saoirse Nic Gabhainn are leading the University's Health Behaviour in School-aged Children (HBSC) Ireland team (Cois Coiribe). This national study has been repeated seven times, every four years since 1998. Over time, it has had a substantial impact on policy and strategy around children's and young people's health and wellbeing. As a long-term project, it has established, monitored and shaped national indicators of child health. Through the Irish HBSC team's leadership, it has significantly enhanced youth participation in European policy making.
