





Menstrual Health and Period Poverty*

Missed school as a result of period symptoms

Overall, 60% of girls who have begun to menstruate report ever missing school as a result of period symptoms. There are statistically significant differences by age group and social class. Older girls are more likely to report ever missing school as a result of period symptoms than younger girls. Girls from the middle social class group are more likely to report ever missing school as a result of period symptoms than girls from other social class groups.


Figure 62: Percentages of girls who report ever missing school as a result of period symptoms



Our Evidence-based Approach







Aims and strategy of Debunking



Counteract Misinformation

Tips on how to identify fact vs fiction and point them to reliable sources of information about their sexual health.



Enhances the RSE Curriculum

Designed by academics, medical professionals, and science communicators, incorporating insights from regular teen focus groups to ensure content meets their needs and interests



Reduce Stigma

That impacts students' confidence in talking openly about sexual health-related topics



Access to Health Professionals

Experts in obstetrics, gynaecology, general practice, contraception, infectious diseases and consent



Empower Informed Decision-making

To discuss sexual health openly and confidently with friends, family or medical professionals.



Addressing Comfort Levels

Students: May not feel comfortable discussing sexual health with teachers.

Teachers: May lack confidence in advising on

sensitive/medical issues.






Debunking in numbers

To date, *Debunking the Myths* has reached a total of **166 schools** across the Republic of Ireland.











Evaluation (n=827)








Students' reported familiarity with topics addressed significantly increased (p<0.001)


Evaluation (n=827)



Students' awareness of practical emergency contraception resources significantly increased (p=0.001), while perceptions of cost as a barrier decreased (p < 0.001)


